Zero Injury Award

PURPOSE The Zero Injury Award is given to companies whose craft persons working for the company have not suffered a work related accident resulting in loss of consciousness, restriction of work or motion, transfer to another job or requiring medical treatment other than first-aid.

To support this application, please provide five copies of the application, along with the following:

- Substantiate that the company qualifies by the award by attaching the company's 2009 OSHA 300 log.
- Note the total number of craft hours worked in 2009.

IF YOUR COMPANY IS IN THE MICCS CERTIFICATION PROGRAM, NOTE THIS ON THE SECOND PAGE. YOUR COMPANY MUST HAVE UNDERGONE THE VERIFICATION PROCESS IN THE CERTIFICATION PROGRAM IN ORDER TO QUALIFY FOR THIS.

- Provide a written narrative of up to three pages that explains to the judges the outstanding factors or efforts that made it possible for the company to achieve this high level of performance. The narrative will be used by the judges to affirm the applicant's commitment to safety and may be used to assist in explaining the accomplishment of the winner of the award to the audience during its presentation.
- Image of the nominee's corporate logo on CD

NOTE A representative of the nominated company should be present at the Awards Celebration so that, should they win, they will be present to accept.

DEADLINE Entry must be received by the MICCS office no later than **FRIDAY, MARCH 19, 2010.**

ZERO INJURY AWARD

To be recognized for achieving the MICCS goal of ZERO INJURY, the following criteria must be met (please check if appropriate):

- Craft persons working for the company have not suffered a work related accident resulting in loss of consciousness, restriction of work or motion, transfer to another job, or requiring medical treatment other than first aid.
- The above criteria can be substantiated by no accidents being recorded in 2009 in columns G, H, I and J on the company's OSHA 300 log.
- A written narrative of up to three pages in length must accompany this application, explaining to the judges the outstanding factors or efforts that made it possible for the company to achieve this high level of performance. The narrative will be used by the judges to affirm the applicant's commitment to safety; and, may be used in whole or part to assist in explaining to the audience the means used by the company to achieve the award.
- Note the total number of craft hours worked in 2009.
